Development of a Novel Mouse Model for Hematopoietic Stem Cell Specific Lineage Tracing and Imaging | Qi Yu

Qi Yu is from Shanghai, China, and she came to the United States in 2013 for college. In 2017, she graduated from Brandeis University with a BS and MS degree in Biochemistry. Because of her interest in Stem Cell and Regenerative Biology, shortly after graduation, she joined Dr. Fernando Camargo's lab in the BCH Hematology/Oncology Department as a research assistant. She is currently a research technologist in the Camargo lab working on an independent project studying native state hematopoiesis in mice. She is also the Co-Director for PRADA. During her spare time, she enjoys doing yoga, snowboarding, and bouldering.

COVID-19's Impact on Patients with Eating Disorders: The Relationship between Change in Eating Disorder/Mental Health Symptoms and Eating Disorder Motivation to Recover | Julia Vitagliano

Julia Vitagliano is a Clinical Research Assistant in the Division of Adolescent/Young Adult Medicine at Boston Children's Hospital. She graduated from Connecticut College in 2019 with a BA in Psychology, Gender and Women's Studies, and a Public Policy concentration. Under the supervision of Dr. Tracy Richmond, Julia works on the RECOVERY Study, a webbased registry of patients that seeks to understand the longitudinal experience of youth with eating disorders, including their trajectories of illness relative to care. Julia also works with Dr. S. Bryn Austin, Director of the Strategic Training Initiative for the Prevention of Eating Disorders (STRIPED), a public health incubator centered on bringing eating disorders prevention into the mainstream of training for adolescent medicine and public health. Julia is passionate about eating disorders prevention and weight stigma, and hopes to dedicate her career towards eating disorders prevention programs and research in elementary and middle aged students.

An Exploratory, Mixed-Methods Study of Parent Attitudes Toward Enhancing Cognition and Clinical Research Trials in Down Syndrome | Maggie Hojlo

Maggie began her role as a Clinical Research Assistant in the Division of Developmental Medicine (DDM) and the Department of Psychiatry after graduating from Colby College in 2017 with a Psychology major and Environmental Studies minor. Within the DDM, Maggie helps coordinate projects in the Down Syndrome Program, including mixed-methods studies about family attitudes and quality of life, a fitness program for teens, and a behavioral intervention for toddlers. In Psychiatry, Maggie has helped create a repository of cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) that will allow researchers to more precisely map pediatric developmental curves, and she also works on studies focused on rare genetic findings and clinical/family outcomes of individuals with Very Early/Early Onset Psychosis, as well as those with Early Onset Major Depressive Disorder and Suicidality. Maggie recently became the new chair of PRADA's Public Health, Community and Advocacy subcommittee.

Trauma Exposure and Mental Health Outcomes Among Central American and Mexican Children Held in Immigration Detention at the United States-Mexico Border | Anne Elizabeth Sidamon-Eristoff

Anne Elizabeth received her BA in Spanish and Portuguese with a certificate in neuroscience from Princeton University. In addition, she completed the pre-med course of study and worked as a Research Assistant in the Peña Lab in the Princeton Neuroscience Institute studying early life stress in mouse models. At Children's, she works as a Clinical Research Assistant I in Michelle Bosquet-Enlow's Biobehavioral Research Laboratory on the NIH ECHO (Environmental Influences on Child Health Outcomes) study. She is interested in how early experiences shape neurodevelopment and broader health outcomes. In particular, she is interested in the mechanisms by which early life stress may increase risk for subsequent psychopathology and in identifying factors that promote resilience. Anne Elizabeth hopes to pursue an MD/PhD in cognitive neuroscience so that she may engage in high-impact research on early life adversity that directly benefits future patients.


PHCA Event: Climate Change as a Social **Determinant of Health**
